まえがき

1994年3月、文部省の大型コレクション収集計画により宮崎大学附属図書館に「イギリス労働運動史家アラン・ハット旧蔵 世界労働運動史コレクション」が所蔵されることになった。同コレクションの第一推薦者であった私は、図書館職員とともにコレクションの目録作成に2年間携わり、目録原稿(英文)を完成させることができた。

この間得た知見をもとに私は、本コレクションの紹介をアラン・ハットの経歴紹介も加えて 『大原社会問題研究所雑誌』1997年3月号で行った¹³。さらに、国外向けに英文にて『社会史国 際評論』1997年4月号で簡単な紹介も行った²³。

イギリス並びに英ソ関係を中心とした世界労働運動史の一大コレクションである本コレクションは,著名なイギリス共産党系の労働運動史家であり、その一方で有能な新聞印刷術の専門家であったアラン・ハット(G. Allen Hutt; 1901-73)一個人の意志によって個人史資料も含めて系統的に集められた。本コレクションの稀少価値を高めさせているのは、運動の渦中にあった者以外では入手困難なビラや切抜類、さらには未刊行のノート、草稿類が含まれることである。

残念なのは、本コレクションの目録刊行が未だ目処がつかないことであり、いわば応急処置として私は序文を付した目録を私費にて数部製本し³¹、マンチェスターの労働運動史ナショナル・ミュジアムやアムステルダムの社会史国際研究所等への寄贈を果たしたにすぎない。

本コレクションの大部を占める書籍については、個別の書誌データとしてだが学術情報センターへのデータ登録が済まされている。本稿では、登録もれのうち最も重要な切抜、ノート、草稿類の詳細データを掲載することにする。それは実質的には、雄松堂書店が用意した販売用目録を参考に私が作成したものである。

ハットは何をどのように研究したのか。もちろんその結果は彼の著作に結実しているものが 多いであろうが、その途中経過を知るには、彼が残した切抜、ノート、草稿類が格好の資料と なる。ハット自身、それらをフォールダー、ファイル、バインダー、ノートブックなどを利用 してテーマ毎にまとめており、図書館作業では変更をほとんど加えないまま、"Memorabilia"(記憶すべき事柄の記録類)と一括して分類・整理を行い、その数はフォールダー、ファイルなどの単位で数えて52点にのぼる。中身の概略についての紹介は、既に上述の『大原社会問題研究所雑誌』で行ってはいるが、便宜上ここに(一部加筆の上)再録しておく。

- 1) マルクス主義,レーニン主義に関する著作のタイプ訳稿やノート類。その中で,レーニン著作集から16点が訳されタイプ打ちされ,そして1冊に製本されたものが目を引くが,それはロシア共産党の歴史を教えるコースのために準備された教材であった。
- 2) 炭坑夫の賃金引下げ等をめぐる労使紛争から引き起こされた1926年5月4-12日のイギリス・ゼネラル・ストライキに関する原史料を集めた重要なフォールダー。その中には、ハットが居住するロンドンで集めることのできた10点の小機関紙、ビラ類がある。とりわけ重要なのは、イギリス共産党もしくはハリー・ポリット夫人によって出された『ワーカーズ・ブレティン』(Workers Bulletin)で、1926年5月4,5,6,13,14日の5つの号が収集されている。ゼネスト関係のノートブックも一つある。
- 3) 1939年の英ソ関係の切抜帳や1929-30年と61年の訪ソ時の旅行ノートの他に,英露関係のほぼ4世紀にわたる歴史をハット自身が書きためたタイプ原稿が25点もある。
- 4) 切抜類でめだつのは、1948年と1968-69年のチェコ-スロヴァキアに関するものであり、 後者には5冊の小冊子類が挿入されているが、いずれもいわゆるチェコ事件についてのソ連 邦ないしチェコの「公式」見解を表したものである。他でも散見するこのような文献類収 集の片寄りは、終生イギリス共産党員であったハットには避けられなかった。その他の切 抜には、第二次大戦中のバルト諸国とフィンランド関係がある。
- 5) 残りは、イギリス労働運動および労働組合に関するもので、ハットのその方面の著作に 結実するノート、草稿類が当然のごとく多い。その中で興味を引くものには、トム・マン (Tom Mann)、ベヴィン (Ernest Bevin) らのフォールダーがあり、ロンドン、クライド サイドとスコットランド、そしてランカシャーと南ウェールズの各地域に関する詳細なデー 夕類のファイルがある。
- 6) 本コレクションには残念ながら、書簡類は例外的にしか含まれていない。図書に関する 著者もしくはハットによる書簡(写しを含む)が当該図書に挿入されているのを別にして、 一つのフォールダーにだけまとまって書簡がある。それは、フールスカップ版のタイプ印刷「20年前:同志ハリー・ポリットの共産党総書記としての20周年記念のために」(1949年8月)が入っているフォールダーで、その中に計42通の手紙(ないし写し)がある。
- 7) ハット自身の職業に関する切抜帳やアルバムもある。切抜帳は、特にジャーナリストとして、かつまたタイポグラファー(印刷技術者)として活躍したことを示す記事類を自ら集めた大部のものである。タイポグラファーとしての実際の力量は、とりわけ二つのアルバムによく窺われる。ともに大版のアルバムで、一つには新刊・在庫案内(広告)のためのレイアウト類が、もう一つには本のカヴァー・デザインや広告などの見本類が、それぞれ台紙に貼られている。

それら草稿類が結実した著作の目録についても、本コレクションによって大よそがまとめられるので、ハットの著作目録の第1部として著書目録も、草稿類の詳細データに先だって掲載することにする。ただし残念なことだが、ハット自身の著作で抜けているものがあるので、コレクション未所蔵の著書も別掲しておく。

なお、新聞・雑誌等への掲載記事・論文・書評類については、本コレクション中の切抜帳等によって初めて、より包括的な目録が作成されうる。その作業にはなお時間を要し、著作目録第2部としての公表は、後日の機会に譲りたい。

凡 例

- 1. 著書目録は、本コレクションに所蔵されているアラン・ハットの著書(編著も含む)を 刊行順に配列した。続いて付録として、コレクション未所蔵の同著書(翻訳および再版・改 訂版を除く)を同様に配列した。双方とも、書名をゴシック体で見やすくした。
- 2. 著書目録の各リストの末尾の記号と数字,たとえば [B251] は全体目録中の [B. 書籍・小冊子類 | の通し番号である。
- 3. 草稿・切抜類目録の配列は、ハット自身による分類・整理の原型を活かすかたちで、アルバム、バインダーなど整理文具等のアルファベット順に最初に行い、次にハットが付した各表題や内容に即して考えられるキーワードのアルファベット順に行い、後者の表題・キーワードをゴシック体で見やすくした。
- 4. 草稿・切抜類目録の各リストの最初の右側にある記号と数字, たとえば M1 (397993) の前半部は全体目録中の「M. 草稿・切抜類」の通し番号で, 後半部は宮崎大学附属図書館 蔵書登録番号である。
- 5. アステリクス(*)の後には、書誌データの補記がなされた。
- 6. アステリクス2個(**)の後には、個人コレクションにまつわる注記がなされた。
